CURRICULUM REPORTING POLICY

Rationale

Reporting performance to parents/caregivers and informing school planning and reporting, teachers should report student achievement of outcomes.

Purpose

1. To monitor the progress of students.
2. To diagnose how programs need to be adapted for each student.
3. To plan for subsequent learning.
4. To report student achievement to parents.
5. To report student achievement in terms of the standards in Years 3, 5 and 7.
6. To inform school planning and reporting.

Broad Guidelines

Reporting to parents/caregivers is to consist of –

- A set period of time in term 1 and term 3 for teachers to inform parents/caregivers of their child's progress and achievement
- Informing parents/caregivers when their child experiences learning issues.
- Formal summative reports at the end of each semester
- An 'open night' in term 3
- Year 3,5 and 7 students will have standardized test results in the WALNA.
- Other methods such as telephone conversations, diary entries, letters etc.

Conclusion

Curriculum information when reporting to parents needs to consider the Outcomes and Standards Framework, school devised outcomes, expected levels of achievement, how information is communicated and how individual performance has been determined.
