

Assemblage: Colour Wheel

Year 5 & 6

It's time to revise **Colour Theory** by creating your own **Colour Wheel Assemblage**, made from random objects found in your home and garden!

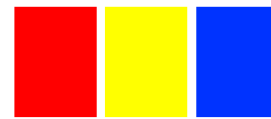
You will need:

- Colourful found household & garden objects
- A large neutral coloured area for a background (floor, table, large piece of white paper etc.)
- Device with a camera & Seesaw app



Step 1

Start with the **Primary Colours** and space objects at equal distance apart. Watch the video again, if you need ideas!

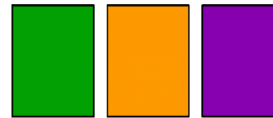


Vocabulary:

Colour, Primary, Secondary, Tertiary, Analogous,, Assemblage, Background, Foreground

Step 2

Move onto the **Secondary Colours**, and space these objects in between the correct **Primary Colours** - just like in the video.

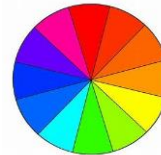


Elements of Art:

Step 3

Now, add the **Tertiary Colours** in between the correct **Primary** and **Secondary Colours**. See the next page for examples.
