

Drawing: Interactive Chalk Murals

Year 5 & 6

This week you will put your **Colour Theory** skills to the test. Get outside and be **creative** by drawing **colourful** chalk murals with a twist! Your drawing will be 'interactive', including yourself as part of the drawing!



Don't have chalk? Click [here](#) for DIY washable chalk paint instructions.

Don't have ingredients? Tape lots of paper together to make a large 'canvas' area, put this on the floor and use crayons on the paper instead.

You will need:

- Chalk
- A large and **safe** outdoor area (with permission) e.g. your driveway
- Device with a camera & Seesaw app

Only If you don't have chalk...

- Cornflour, water & food colouring OR
- Paper, tape & Crayons



Step 1

Find a large and **safe** outdoor area. A front driveway would be great! Get **permission** from your parent to use it for a large chalk mural.



Vocabulary:

Colour, Mural, Background, Middle-ground, Foreground, Contrast, Blending, Gradation, Shading

Step 2

You will need some different coloured **chalk**. The large sidewalk chalk is ideal, but the smaller chalk works just as well (or make your [own!](#)).



Elements of Art:

Line, Shape, Space, Colour, Value

Step 3

Be **creative** and use your **imagination**. Draw large **shapes**, and different **lines**. Add **value** (different shades) and **colour gradation**, by **blending colours** together.



Extra Challenge!

Can you add a **pet** or **another family member** into your mural?

Step 4

Once completed, pose with your mural, ask someone to take a **photo** and upload to **Seesaw**. See the next page for more examples.
