2024 SCHOOL VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Dear Parent/Caregivers

The Beaumaris Primary School School Board has endorsed the schedule of Voluntary Contributions and Charges for 2024. The schedule is broken into four sections and will allow you to calculate all costs that may be incurred throughout the school year.

1. Contributions - Paid at commencement of the new year or in term instalments. These can also be pre-paid at the time of ordering your personal items list

The total amount of voluntary contributions parents/caregivers are being asked to pay has been set at \$60.00 per student which is in line with the School Education Regulations 2000.

At Beaumaris Primary School, the Voluntary Contributions have been allocated by the School Board at \$60.00 per student.

The monies collected will be used to contribute to programs within the school. Although the payments are voluntary this money combined with the money from government and non-government funding allows Beaumaris Primary School students to make the most of the programs offered.

The table below gives you the breakdown of where we will direct your Voluntary Contribution.

2. Charges for Extra Cost Optional Components - Paid at the time the activity is organised

These are costs associated with special programs, excursions and other optional activities. A breakdown of the estimated **maximum charge** for your child's participation in activities for 2024 has been included in the schedule below.

Students can only participate in these activities if they have signed parental permission and have paid the charge associated with the activity.

Please Note: The above calculations are a guide only. Payment is needed when an incursion/excursion is organised and you receive a note via Compass setting out the activity and cost.

Primary Extension Academic Courses (PEAC) 2024 - as advised by North Metropolitan Regional Office PEAC Coordinator

Early Years Extension Program (For eligible schools and identified students only)

Years 1, 2 and 3 \$10 per year

PEAC Program (Identified students only)

Year 4 \$50 - PEAC Induction Day for identified students (Induction for these students to be held December 2024).

Year 5 \$45 - \$215 per year \$15 – Round 1 Introduction to PEAC course cost
\$30 - \$200 – Round 2 and Round 3 PEAC course costs

Year 6 \$45 - \$300 per year - 3 Rounds of PEAC course costs

PEAC Courses range in cost from \$15 to \$100 per Round.

Students can choose from a range of approximately 45 courses per round of varying costs.

Round 1 for all Year 5 students is a foundation Introduction to PEAC (ITP) course and costs \$15.

3. Personal Items List - Paid at the time of ordering or collecting (Please refer to Personal Items Requirement Lists)

The school Personal Items Requirements covers consumables and stationery type items that your child will need in class throughout the year. The charge for the Personal Items List will vary from student to student depending on which year they are enrolled in. Parents may purchase these items from their chosen retailer, or use the nominated school supplier, Campion. It is also important to note that students may need to top-up items over the year.

4. Other Fund Raising Costs – P&C Association Voluntary Contribution per family - Paid to the P&C and supported at the time the fundraising initiative is organised

In 2024 the P&C will fulfil its function of representing parent views and supporting school programs. In support of these activities the P&C will be running various fundraising initiatives in addition to the voluntary P&C contribution of \$50 at the start of the school year. Monies collected will be spent on items which the parent community believes to be of priority in enhancing our children's lives and opportunities at school.
